A Message from Kathy Smith

Many residents have reached out to my office with questions and concerns regarding voting by mail for the November 3, 2020 Election. The Virginia General Assembly convened this week for a special session and one of the items that Governor Northam presented is a decision of whether or not to allow localities to install drop boxes. Currently, the Virginia Code does not allow Fairfax County to install drop boxes for ballot collection. We are waiting to see what action the General Assembly takes.

In the meantime, here are ways to ensure your ballot is counted this November. You can request a ballot via mail and take it to the Fairfax County Government Center (12000 Government Center Parkway, Fairfax, VA 22035) and deliver it to the Office of Elections. Furthermore, satellite voting locations will open beginning October 14, 2020 and you can return your ballot to one of these locations. **Please note that the ballot must be returned to the Assistant Registrar.** If you do not wish to enter one of these facilities, curbside service will be available with a phone number to call. If you explain you are there to drop off your ballot the Assistant Registrar will come out to collect the ballot. Finally, if you do enter the facility to drop off the ballot you need not wait in line. You can go the front and inform them you are there to drop off your ballot. Fairfax County's New Program Bolsters Virtual Learning:

- <u>Supporting Return to School</u> (SRS) is a new program developed in response to the COVID-19 pandemic and this year's virtual return to school.
- SRS will provide full-day on-site programming for children in Kindergarten through sixth grade, Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 6:00 p.m.
- The program serves children of families residing in Fairfax County and the City of Fairfax. A sliding fee scale will be available for income eligible families.
- Enrollment for the SRS program begins August 24, 2020. Space is limited.

CARES Act Funding for Affordable Housing Providers:

- Fairfax County has allocated nearly \$2.5 million in supplemental Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding to affordable housing providers in need of financial assistance due to the unexpected loss of rental income during the COVID-19 pandemic.
- The funding is to be used to cover the rental obligations of eligible tenants who are unable to pay their full or partial rent due to the COVID-19 pandemic. There is <u>NO</u> <u>PENALTY OR REPAYMENT</u> associated with this assistance.

Transportation News



VDOT: Route 29 in Centreville Reduced to Two Lanes Under I-66 This Weekend:

- Installation of beams for the new I-66 bridges over Route 29 in Centreville will require reducing Route 29 (Lee Highway) under I-66 to a single travel lane in each direction starting at 9 p.m. Friday, August 21, continuing through 5 a.m. Monday, August 24. Two-way traffic will run on Route 29 North during this period. Expect delays.
- Drivers using ramps to and from I-66 will not be allowed to make left turns during this time.
- During the overnight hours Friday through Sunday nights, August 21-23, flaggers will alternate a single lane of traffic in each direction.

VDOT: Fox Mill Road Closed in Oakton Aug. 24-27:

 Fox Mill Road between Bronzedale Drive and Hunt Road will be closed to through traffic (weather permitting) from 8 a.m. Monday, Aug. 24 to 5 p.m. Thursday, Aug. 27 to replace a stormwater pipe. <u>Details</u>

- Those needing to reach properties along Fox Mill Road will have access; however, traffic will not be able to go beyond the point of pipe replacement in either direction.
- Through traffic will be detoured via Bronzedale Drive, Waples Mill Road (Route 664), West Ox Road (Route 608) and Vale Road (Route 672) back to Fox Mill Road.

Fairfax Connector Returns to Full Service, Launches New and Enhanced Bus Routes on August 29, 2020:

- Fairfax Connector will resume full service on all routes starting Saturday, August 29, 2020, with service enhancements including a new commuter route from the Stringfellow Road Park and Ride lot to Southwest Washington, D.C., launching simultaneously.
- Rear door entry and exit required. Please note that while rear door entry is required, no fares will be collected, and all routes continue to be free.
- Wearing a face covering on the bus is mandatory. For further details, click here.

WMATA: Metro Announces Silver & Orange Line Station Reopenings:

The project to reconstruct outdoor platforms at four Orange Line stations west of Ballston is well ahead of schedule, allowing the early reopening of Silver and Orange Line stations. Details.

- In partnership with the Centreville Labor Resource Center, Healthworks for Northern Virginia is offering FREE COVID-19 testing every Tuesday from 8:00 a.m. to 10:00 a.m. for walk-ins and 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. by appointment only. Location: 5944 Centreville Crest Lane, Centreville, VA.
- **Testing is available to everyone**, and you do not need to have symptoms to request a test.

When - and How - Can You Safely Visit Grandparents and Older Adults?:

- Here are some scientific facts from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to keep in mind as you make your decision whether or not to visit with family members who are older.
 - 1. Older people are at higher risk for severe COVID-19 infection and death.
 - 2. People can spread the disease without having symptoms.
 - 3. A negative COVID-19 test is not a guaranteed clearance for safely visiting with grandparents.
 - 4. For grandparents in long-term care facilities visitors are restricted. Call ahead to ensure you know the facility's policy prior to arrival.

2020 Census:

Enumerators (census takers) will be visiting households that have not yet responded to help collect Census information in a fast, safe, and confidential way. Field data collection will end by September 30, 2020. Residents in low-response areas may also receive emails asking them to complete the 2020 Census. If you respond online or by phone today, a census taker is less likely to have to visit your home to collect your response. Households can still complete the 2020 Census online, by phone at 844-330-2020 (TTY 711) or by completing the paper survey received in the mail.
