From The Principal

Family,

Week 4 is in the books already and the "school" is still standing. This plane is still flying and gaining lift while we continue to add needed parts to it. But as I shared with you last week, we have some of the best engineers working on this and we are doing pretty well. As I am sure you know, the reality is that this virtual teaching and learning is tough for so many. I share with the staff every day for the most part how proud I am of their efforts; and I honestly am. But I also have to share with them that I also am proud of the fact that they continue to fight through adversity every day because not every lesson goes smoothly, and not every link works flawlessly. And yet they return to the computer day in and day out to ensure that our students are being taken care of.

I also want to acknowledge our students who continue to be resilient and show their grit because getting up in this environment and performing in class can be tough. When the internet connection doesn't always work properly, they continue to try, they restart their computers and routers, and email their teachers, or even write to me (like I actually have an answer). When they are feeling alone, they reach out to our human resources, and they take the deep breath and return to class again. Please applaud your children for continuing strongly along the correct path toward success in this environment. No, in fact, hug them because again, it is not easy, and they deserve to know that you know.

I have taken the time to drop into classes to watch and listen in on lessons. I see the participation. And no, it is not ideal, but I see the creativity from the teachers and the

learning of the students. I really am proud to say that there is true learning taking place. And what is great, is that while the students aren't in the brick and mortar building, they will be prepared for the next steps beyond this school year.

We are continuing to prepare for the return to school for our students. As you may have heard from the Superintendent, some of our students will be returning to the building sooner than later. Those students are our lower level English Learner students, our students with Intellectual Disabilities, and our students in our upper level Automotive Technology classes (levels 2 & 3) where hands on experiences are absolutely critical in the early stages of the course. These families have already been contacted about when their children are expected to return to school, and we are excited about their impending return.

The building is being equipped with the necessary equipment to ensure student safety, staff will have their required personal protective equipment (PPE) and we are ensuring our protocols and safeguards for staff and students to follow are in place. When our students return we will be able to welcome them back into a safe and protected environment.

I, along with Mr. Garner, met with our Online Newspaper staff to get an update on their progress. I am proud to say that the Stallion Nation Network Newspaper will be up and running in the very near future. Ms. Avril Silva and Ms. Victoria Rankin are heading up this effort and are going to provide our students with a powerful voice in the South County learning community and beyond. I am very excited about this initiative and I am sure that you will be equally pleased!

If your child is involved in a course that has a class fee, those class fees will be paid through MySchoolBucks wherever possible. Those invoices to parents will go out on 10/7/20. Please be on the lookout for that correspondence. Keeping on the same page around fees, I am happy to share with you that FCPS will not be charging families the FCPS On fee of \$50.00 this year which was paid last year to cover laptop issues.

Face Covering Exemptions

Face Coverings to Mitigate the Spread of Infectious Disease (Regulation 2109) requires face coverings for all students, staff and visitors during transport and while on school property. Any student (2 years of age and older) seeking exemption from the face covering requirement due to a medical condition must provide a written statement from their physician indicating that this is medically necessary.

I shared that message with the rest of the school staff and the reaction was so positive and impactful. PSAT for 11th Graders SCHS

On Thursday, October 29, South County High School **eleventh graders** will have the opportunity to take the PSAT/NMSQT. FCPS will cover the cost for any eleventh grade student to take this test.

To help the school prepare for testing, families are asked to complete the form below by Friday, October 9. This form asks about participation in the test, the need or bus transportation, and interest in free breakfast or lunch on the day of the test. Note: the student must access this form via their @fcpsschools.net account.

South County HS: PSAT/NMSQT Intent to Participate Form

A translated version of the form content may be found on the PSAT/NMSQT Intent webpage (https://www.fcps.edu/node/42099). Due to health and safety protocols, FCPS sites cannot accept walk-ins on the day of the exam.

General information about the PSAT/NMSQT test format is available on the College Board webpage (https://collegereadiness.collegeboard.org/psat-nmsqt-psat-10). Thursday, October 29 has been designated for asynchronous learning in FCPS high schools, so students who choose to take the PSAT/NMSQT will not miss synchronous learning time with their teachers.

For students who want to practice the SAT from the comfort of their own homes, College Board has several SAT Practice tests available on their website.
