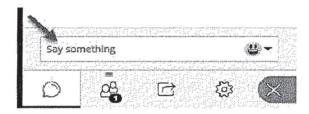

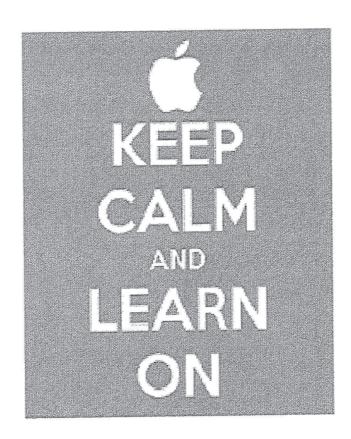

Guiding Principles for Learning and Wellness During Distance Learning

- Staff require time to develop lesson plans and collaborate with colleagues, time to provide direct and guided instruction for students, time to check-in with students, and time for their own health and family needs during school closure
- Students have differing developmental considerations regarding screen time, attention spans, and independent learning, which should be addressed in teachers' instructional design; student access and support structures vary widely
- Families and caregivers must provide guidance related to scheduling learning times for their children that help avoid conflict with use of home resources; caregivers will require time for their own health and family





What are we trying to accomplish for students?

- Continuity of learning to the greatest degree possible
- Ongoing connections between teachers and peers
- Sense of normalcy and routine during a stressful time

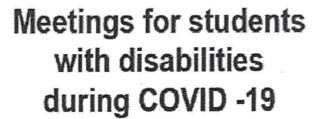

Special Education Timelines

From Virginia Department of Education COVID-19 March 17th FAQ:

- Existing regulations already provide for certain types of flexibility with regard to holding meetings and for extending timelines.
- For instance, if the parent and school division agree in writing to extend the 65 business day timeline to obtain additional data that cannot be obtained within the 65 business days, the evaluation/eligibility timeline may be extended.
- FCPS is working on a letter for schools to communicate this information to parents.

From Virginia Department of Education COVID-19 FAQ:

- This is so that evaluations may take place once schools reopen and eligibility can be completed.

Timelines - Eligibility



- Face to face evaluations are suspended while school is not in session

There have been cases throughout the country where virtual meetings/classes have been publicly broadcasted when hackers and non-students have taken over and presented inappropriate material.

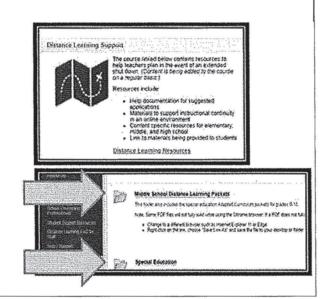

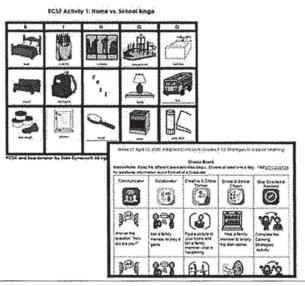
Research-based Programs



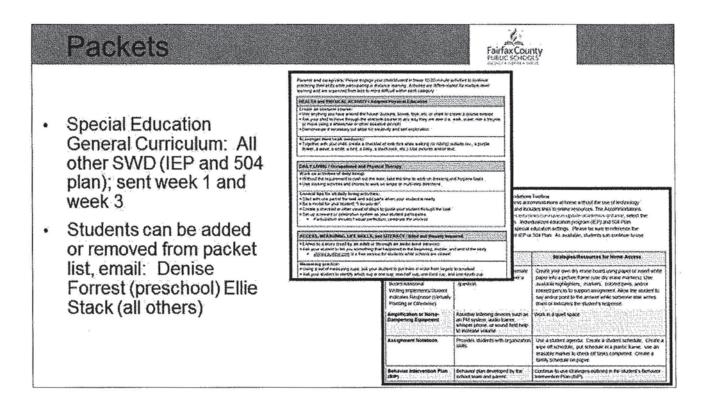
- Depending on the program, some aspects of the researched-based programs (RBP) we use during the year can be used via distance learning.

ABA Coaches and Behavior Intervention Teachers



ABA Coaches:

- Will support their assigned teachers in developing lessons that break down student skills utilizing verbal behavior and applied behavior analysis
- · Will assist their assigned teachers with student behavior needs (PAC, EAC, Cat B)
- · Will collaborate to support any other teacher needs as requested
- · Will connect with teachers on a weekly basis

Behavior Intervention Teachers (BITs):

- · Provide behavioral intervention support as needed to general education and special education teachers
- Assist teachers with incorporating behavioral best practices in a distance learning environment
- Consult/collaborate on individual case referrals and requests for continued support in their assigned schools
- · Provide professional development as needed to schools and school staff
- Consult and collaborate with parents/guardians as needed on behavioral strategies to support online learning in the home environment
- · Consult/collaborate with school staff regarding IEP goal(s) and student needs

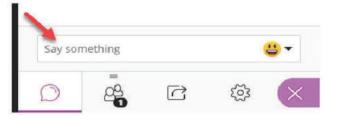

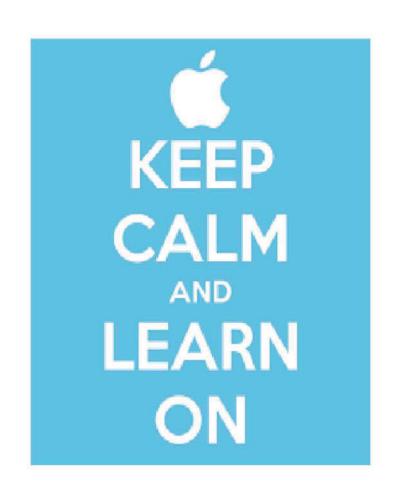

Guiding Principles for Learning and Wellness During Distance Learning

- Staff require time to develop lesson plans and collaborate with colleagues, time to provide direct and guided instruction for students, time to check-in with students, and time for their own health and family needs during school closure
- Students have differing developmental considerations regarding screen time, attention spans, and independent learning, which should be addressed in teachers' instructional design; student access and support structures vary widely
- Families and caregivers must provide guidance related to scheduling learning times for their children that help avoid conflict with use of home resources; caregivers will require time for their own health and family



What are we trying to accomplish for students?

- Continuity of learning to the greatest degree possible
- Ongoing connections between teachers and peers
- Sense of normalcy and routine during a stressful time



Moving from student choice activities to more teacher-directed experiences for elementary students

Procedures for Hosting Virtual Meetings

Prior to the meeting:

- Contact parent to schedule the meeting, document on the contact log/504 documentation and ask for any information they may want to share regarding their child
- Schedule language interpreter if needed
- Send confirmation email with appropriate notice letter and links to public page for necessary documents (i.e., Parent Input form, Procedural Safeguards, ESY, Age of Majority, Diploma Options, and copies of blank forms)
- Send draft IEP home 3-5 days prior to meeting
- Send teleconference phone number and access code OR BBCU participant link 2 days before the meeting
- NOTE: Do not send the parent or other participants the teleconference "Host Passcode" or BBCU moderator link
 - Guidance Documents Coming Soon



Procedures for Hosting Virtual Meetings

During the meeting:

- Review Meeting Norms (suggested norms will be provided)
- Record the session if parent indicates they are recording
- Conduct meeting following standard protocol
- Speak slowly, explain your steps in SEA-STARS
- Stick to allotted time (be courteous of the next person who has it reserved)
- Inform parent you will send "hold" copy of the meeting document or any other necessary consent documents after meeting
- Discuss how parent can provide consent at meeting conclusion



Procedures for Hosting Virtual Meetings

After the meeting:

- Send electronic/paper "hold" copy of document home for parent consideration along with completed PWN
- Update contact log entries for each communication with parent
- Confirm receipt of documents with parent and communicate with parents to obtain consent decision via email or phone, if they do not respond within 2 weeks
- Document parent consent in SEA-STARS
- Finalize and/or make current all documents
- Close workflow/process



Instructions for Teleconference Meetings

- Each school will be assigned a temporary teleconference line
- The conference line is to be used judiciously for special education and 504 meetings only
- Schools should create process for scheduling the conference line
- Due to limited resources schools will only get 1 conference line per school.



Instructions for BBCU Meetings

Prior to the meeting:

- Contact your BBCU scheduler (typically your SBTS) to set up a session
- Scheduler will send email to the moderator with the following information:
 - Moderator link and participant link to the BBCU session for the scheduled date and time
- Moderator will send BBCU <u>participant link</u> to participants
- Moderator will access BBCU via VPN to access SEA-STARS
- Scheduler should <u>disable</u> online chat function

Instructions for SEA-STARS BBCU Meetings

During the meeting:

For general instructions/videos on how-to-use-BBCU:

- Moderator (SEA-STARS driver) will display the SEA-STARS screen on each participant's computer screen using BBCU
- Ask participants to refer to email that contains link to the <u>FCPS website</u> that houses all sped documents, such as ESY form, sped diploma options, etc.
- Be mindful of only displaying the student's specific documents by entering through the individual student name
- When validating documents disconnect the SEA-STARS screen from all participants
- All other participants (except PLOP writer) should not be on VPN
- Assign other meeting management roles, i.e., PLOP writer and timekeeper



Consent

- Step 1: Present parent with proposal
- Step 2A: Offer the parent the opportunity to provide verbal consent and document on the PWN
- Step 2B: Ask parent to send an email providing consent when they're ready
- Optional: Parents may provide consent through signature via other electronic means
- Step 3: Case manager uploads any documents to SEA-STARS



Suggested Norms for Virtual Meetings

- Begin and end on time
- Honor the agenda
- Presume positive intentions
- One speaker at a time
- Speak slowly and clearly
- Reduce distractions (silence phones, background sounds, etc.)
- Respect opinions
- Allow everyone to be heard



Special Education Timelines

From Virginia Department of Education COVID-19 March 17th FAQ:

- Existing regulations already provide for certain types of flexibility with regard to holding meetings and for extending timelines.
- For instance, if the parent and school division agree in writing to extend the 65 business day timeline to obtain additional data that cannot be obtained within the 65 business days, the evaluation/eligibility timeline may be extended.
- FCPS is working on a letter for schools to communicate this information to parents.

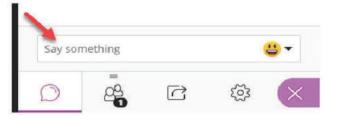

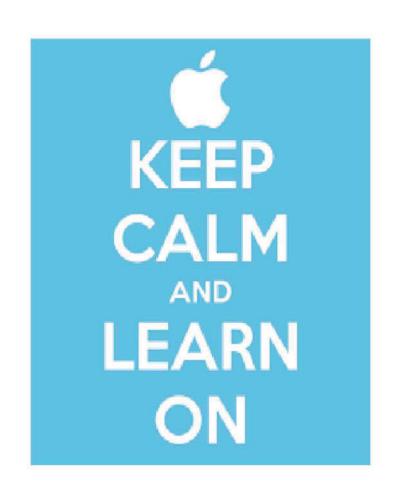

Temporary Learning Plan (TLP)

- Documents goals/objectives, accommodations, and services to be provided during school closure
- Individualized for each student
- Some students who require IEPs will have this information noted on the PLOP
- TLP template coming soon!

Documenting Services on IEPs

- Goals, accommodations, and services to be provided during school closures are documented on the PLOP page
- For annual and initial IEPs, services begin in <u>August 2020</u> and go through the due date of the IEP in Spring 2021
- No services added for the rest of this school year

- Meetings to address unique situations
- Continued meetings from prior to/during the break
- Specific needs



Procedures for Hosting Virtual Meetings

Prior to the meeting:

- Contact parent to schedule the meeting, document on the contact log/504 documentation and ask for any information they may want to share regarding their child
- Schedule language interpreter if needed
- Send confirmation email with appropriate notice letter and links to public page for necessary documents (i.e., Parent Input form, Procedural Safeguards, ESY, Age of Majority, Diploma Options, and copies of blank forms)
- Send draft IEP home 3-5 days prior to meeting
- Send teleconference phone number and access code OR BBCU participant link 2 days before the meeting
- NOTE: Do not send the parent or other participants the teleconference "Host Passcode" or BBCU moderator link
 - Guidance Documents Coming Soon



Procedures for Hosting Virtual Meetings

During the meeting:

- Review Meeting Norms (suggested norms will be provided)
- Record the session if parent indicates they are recording
- Conduct meeting following standard protocol
- Speak slowly, explain your steps in SEA-STARS
- Stick to allotted time (be courteous of the next person who has it reserved)
- Inform parent you will send "hold" copy of the meeting document or any other necessary consent documents after meeting
- Discuss how parent can provide consent at meeting conclusion



Procedures for Hosting Virtual Meetings

After the meeting:

- Send electronic/paper "hold" copy of document home for parent consideration along with completed PWN
- Update contact log entries for each communication with parent
- Confirm receipt of documents with parent and communicate with parents to obtain consent decision via email or phone, if they do not respond within 2 weeks
- Document parent consent in SEA-STARS
- Finalize and/or make current all documents
- Close workflow/process



Instructions for Teleconference Meetings

- Each school will be assigned a temporary teleconference line
- The conference line is to be used judiciously for special education and 504 meetings only
- Schools should create process for scheduling the conference line



Instructions for BBCU Meetings

Prior to the meeting:

- Contact your BBCU scheduler (typically your SBTS) to set up a session
- Scheduler will send email to the moderator with the following information:
 - Moderator link and participant link to the BBCU session for the scheduled date and time
- Moderator will send BBCU <u>participant link</u> to participants
- Moderator will access BBCU via VPN to access SEA-STARS
- Scheduler should <u>disable</u> online chat function

Instructions for SEA-STARS BBCU Meetings

During the meeting:

For general instructions/videos on how-to-use-BBCU:

- Moderator (SEA-STARS driver) will display the SEA-STARS screen on each participant's computer screen using BBCU
- Ask participants to refer to email that contains link to the <u>FCPS website</u> that houses all sped documents, such as ESY form, sped diploma options, etc.
- Be mindful of only displaying the student's specific documents by entering through the individual student name
- When validating documents disconnect the SEA-STARS screen from all participants
- All other participants (except PLOP writer) should not be on VPN
- Assign other meeting management roles, i.e., PLOP writer and timekeeper



Consent

Step 1: Present parent with proposal

Step 2A: Offer the parent the opportunity to provide verbal consent and document on the PWN

Step 2B: Ask parent to send an email providing consent when they're ready

Optional: Parents may provide consent through signature via other electronic means

Step 3: Case manager uploads any documents to SEA-STARS



Suggested Norms for Virtual Meetings

- Begin and end on time
- Honor the agenda
- Presume positive intentions
- One speaker at a time
- Speak slowly and clearly
- Reduce distractions (silence phones, background sounds, etc.)
- Respect opinions
- Allow everyone to be heard



Special Education Timelines

From Virginia Department of Education COVID-19 March 17th FAQ:

- Existing regulations already provide for certain types of flexibility with regard to holding meetings and for extending timelines.
- For instance, if the parent and school division agree in writing to extend the 65 business day timeline to obtain additional data that cannot be obtained within the 65 business days, the evaluation/eligibility timeline may be extended.
- FCPS is working on a letter for schools to communicate this information to parents.
