




# (34 CFR 300.306 through 34 CFR 300.311) 8VAC20-81-80 (D)(3) Eligibility

Procedures for determining eligibility and educational need.

- 3. Observation.
- a. The local educational agency shall ensure that the child is observed in the child's learning environment (including the general education classroom setting) to document the child's academic performance and behavior in the areas of difficulty.

# 8VAC20-81-80 (D)(3) Eligibility

- b. The eligibility group, in determining whether a child is a child with a disability shall:
- (1) Use information from an observation in routine classroom instruction and monitoring of the child's performance that was done before the child was referred for an evaluation; or
- (2) Have at least one member of the eligibility group conduct an observation of the child's academic performance in the general education classroom after the child has been referred for an evaluation and parental consent has been obtained consistent with the requirements of 8VAC20-81-170.

# 8VAC20-81-70 (C)(13) Evaluation and Reevaluation

c. The relevant behavior, if any, noted during the observation of the child and the relationship of that behavior to the child's academic functioning.

For a child suspected of having a specific learning disability, the evaluation shall include an observation of academic performance in the regular classroom by at least one team member other than the child's regular teacher. In the case of a child of less than school age or out of school, a team member shall observe the child in an environment appropriate for a child of that age.



# In VA, Hearing screening required as follows:


- Grades 3, 7, and 10—unless tested as part of the School Entrance Health Form (See *Code of Virginia*, § 22.1-273.); or the parents or guardians of such student object on religious grounds and the students show no obvious evidence of any defect or disease of the ears; or any such student has an Individualized Education Program or a Section 504 Plan that documents a defect of hearing or a disease of the ears and the principal determines that such a test would not identify any previously unknown defect of hearing or a disease of the ears.
- All children within 60 administrative working days of initial enrollment in a public school (see <u>Regulations Governing Special Education Programs for Children with Disabilities in Virginia.</u>).
- The hearing of each child with a disability shall be tested during the eligibility process prior to be placement in a special education program (see <u>Regulations Governing Special Education Programs for Children with Disabilities in Virginia.</u>)

# SPED REGS: SCREENINGS

Child Find 8VAC20-81-50 Screenings for Hearing, Vision, Fine and Gross Motor and Speech and Voice

### Eligibility 8VAC20-81-70 (14)

- 14. Each child is assessed by a qualified professional in all areas relating to the suspected disability, including, if appropriate, health, vision, hearing, social and emotional status, general intelligence, academic performance, communicative status, motor abilities, and adaptive behavior. This may include educational, medical, sociocultural, psychological, or developmental assessments.
- a. The hearing of each child suspected of having a disability shall be screened during the eligibility process prior to initial determination of eligibility for special education and related services.
- b. A complete audiological assessment, including tests that will assess inner and middle ear functioning, shall be performed on each child who is hearing impaired or deaf or who fails two hearing screening tests.



# **Community-Based Attestation Form**

- In-person, community-based services will resume on March 22, 2021 to students receiving homebound or homebased services, early childhood special education services in childcare centers and homes, and students parentally placed in private schools who receive related services through individual service plans at private schools or other school locations.
- In order to mitigate the spread of COVID-19, a variety of mitigation strategies, identified collaboratively with the Fairfax County Health Department (FCHD), will be implemented to support student and staff safety.
- FCPS seeks your partnership and collaboration in this effort through the implementation of the following eight (8) mitigation strategies, shared by staff and families, during implementation of community-based services.

# Remote Evaluations: Presence Learning

### The Presence Learning Platform:


- Will allow psychologists who are teleworking during the COVID-19 pandemic to conduct psychological evaluations remotely
- Supports 31 practitioners who were trained on January 11<sup>th</sup> and January 15<sup>th</sup>, 2021
  - 16 are using it regularly.
  - 36 remote evaluations have been completed, with another 15 scheduled for the near future.
  - 10 assessment monitors, hired specifically for this purpose, are supporting the remote psychologists by providing in-person assistance with technology and student supervision during testing in the school buildings.

# **Summer Recovery Academy Document**

### **Summer Recovery Academy**

Recovery Services are available to students with disabilities whose teams determined there remains a significant educational impact due to the COVID-19 school closure and the virtual learning this school year. Recovery Services are designed to address learning gaps and are determined by IEP teams.

### WHERE:

- ESY sites
- On a limited case by case basis, Recovery Services may be scheduled at base or attending school.

### WHEN:

Main session, co-located with ESY June 28-July 23, 2021\* Additional sessions, if required, July 26-August 12, 2021\*

- Students who attend ESY or participate in the comprehensive summer school offerings may need to receive Recovery Services outside the timeframe listed above.
- For students receiving Recovery Services at the end of the ESY day, schedule no more than 1 hour of Recovery Services.\*

### **Summer Recovery Academy - Employment Opportunities**

Currently, there are 153 recovery teachers.

### Staff needed:

- Recovery Teachers
- Recovery Teacher/Lead per ESY site
- Recovery Support Staff (IAs)

# Recovery Service Reminders-Spring & Summer

- If you do not have a teacher at your school to provide the Recovery Services:
  - Propose the start date of services at least 2 weeks from IEP date to ensure a teacher can be assigned, contact parents, plan, and begin instruction.
  - Add an explanation in the PWN that we will adjust the start date and honor the number of hours if services are delayed due to finding an instructor or related service provider.
  - Receive consent to IEP and fill out the <u>Recovery Teacher Request Form</u> found on the <u>DPE Intranet page</u>.
  - Send Ellen Glaser the completed spreadsheet, once the teacher has been assigned.
- Be sure to finalize the IEP and workflow!

### Where:

- Paired with current ESY sites
- Limited case by case, Recovery Services may be scheduled at base or attending schools as available
- Can occur alongside ESY or after ESY services
- Individual or small group to work on targeted skills
- Assigned teachers may change based on teacher availability
- Recovery Services may also need to be delivered in the fall

### WHEN:

- Main session, co-located with ESY June 28-July 23, 2021\*
- Additional sessions, if required, July 26-August 12, 2021\*
  - Students who attend ESY or participate in the comprehensive summer school offerings may need to receive Recovery Services outside the timeframe listed above.\*
- For students receiving Recovery Services at the end of the ESY day, schedule up to 1 hour of recovery services
- For students receiving Recovery Services only during the weeks of June 28-July 23, 2021, schedule 3 hours per day for elementary and 4 hours per day for secondary, if possible.\*
- For the additional sessions during the weeks of July 26-August 12, 2021, please schedule services in 1-3 hours per day of services, if possible.\*

\*Services are not limited to the dates and times.

### For students attending ESY with Recovery Services:


Transportation will be provided at the end of the day at a designated time.

### For students attending the ESY site to receive Recovery Services only:

- For the morning, transportation will be provided based on the ESY site bell schedule and AM drop off.
- For pick up, transportation can be provided at a designated time.
- For students receiving services at their school site, please consult with the transportation supervisor for your school and Ellen Glaser.

**Note:** Transportation cannot be provided before ESY hours for either elementary or secondary students.


